FINAL ORDER

I. DIRECTOR'S CONSIDERATION

A. Default. This matter has come before Consumer Services Division Director and Enforcement Chief Chuck Cross (Division Director), the designee of the Director of the Department of Financial Institutions of the State of Washington, pursuant to RCW 34.05.440(1). On June 23, 2004, the Director through her designee Chuck Cross, entered a Statement of Charges and Notice of Intention to Enter an Order to Revoke Consumer Loan License (Statement of Charges). A copy of the Statement of Charges is attached and incorporated into this order by this reference. The Statement of Charges was accompanied by a cover letter dated June 23, 2004, a Notice of Opportunity to Defend and Opportunity for Hearing, and blank Applications for Adjudicative Hearing for JP Funding, Inc. and Joseph Parker, President and Owner. The Department of Financial Institutions of the State of Washington (Department) served the Statement of Charges, cover letter dated June 23, 2004, Notice of Opportunity to Defend and Opportunity for Hearing, and blank Applications for Adjudicative Hearing for JP Funding, Inc. and Joseph Parker on Respondents by Federal Express on June 24, 2004. Neither of the Respondents requested an adjudicative hearing within the 20 days as required under Department of Financial Institutions' rule, WAC 208-08-050.

1 B. Record Presented. The record presented to the Division Director for his review and for
2 entry of a final decision included the Statement of Charges, cover letter dated June 23, 2004, Notice of
3 Opportunity to Defend and Opportunity for Hearing, blank Applications for Adjudicative Hearing for JP
4 Funding, Inc. and Joseph Parker, and documentation of service.

5 C. Factual Findings and Grounds For Order. Pursuant to RCW 34.05.440(1), the Division
6 Director hereby adopts the Statement of Charges, which is attached hereto.

7
8 II. FINAL ORDER

9 Based upon the foregoing, and the Division Director having considered the record and being
10 otherwise fully advised, NOW, THEREFORE:

11 A. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That:

- 12 1. Respondent J P Funding Inc.'s license to conduct the business of a Consumer Loan
13 Company be revoked; and
14
15 2. Respondents are to maintain records in compliance with the Act and provide the Director with
16 the location of the books, records and other information relating to Respondent J P Funding
17 Inc.'s consumer loan business, and the name, address and telephone number of the individual
18 responsible for maintenance of such records in compliance with the Act

19 B. Reconsideration. Pursuant to RCW 34.05.470, Respondents have the right to file a
20 Petition for Reconsideration stating the specific grounds upon which relief is requested. The Petition must be
21 filed in the Office of the Director of the Department of Financial Institutions by courier at 150 Israel Road
22 SW, Tumwater, Washington 98501, or by U.S. Mail at P.O. Box 41200, Olympia, Washington 98504-1200,
23 within ten (10) days of service of the Final Order upon Respondent. The Petition for Reconsideration shall
24

1 not stay the effectiveness of this order nor is a Petition for Reconsideration a prerequisite for seeking judicial
2 review in this matter.

3 A timely Petition for Reconsideration is deemed denied if, within twenty (20) days from the date the
4 petition is filed, the agency does not (a) dispose of the petition or (b) serve the parties with a written notice
5 specifying the date by which it will act on a petition.

6 C. Stay of Order. The Director has determined not to consider a Petition to Stay the
7 effectiveness of this order. Any such requests should be made in connection with a Petition for Judicial
8 Review made under chapter 34.05 RCW and RCW 34.05.550.

9 D. Judicial Review. Respondents have the right to petition the superior court for judicial
10 review of this agency action under the provisions of chapter 34.05 RCW. For the requirements for filing a
11 Petition for Judicial Review, see RCW 34.050.510 and sections following.

12 E. Service. For purposes of filing a Petition for Reconsideration or a Petition for Judicial
13 Review, service is effective upon deposit of this order in the U.S. mail, declaration of service attached hereto.

INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to RCW 31.04.093 and RCW 31.04.165, the Director of the Department of Financial Institutions of the State of Washington (Director) is responsible for the administration of chapter 31.04 RCW, the Consumer Loan Act (Act). After having conducted an investigation pursuant to RCW 31.04.145, and based upon the facts available as of June 22, 2004., the Director institutes this proceeding and finds as follows:

I. FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

1.1 Respondents:

A. **J P Funding Inc.** (Respondent J P Funding) was licensed by the Department of Financial Institutions of the State of Washington (Department) to conduct business as a Consumer Loan Company on January 19, 1999 and has continued to be licensed to date.

B. **Joseph H. Parker** (Respondent Parker) is President of Respondent J PFunding.

1.2 Licensed Location: Respondent J P Funding is licensed to conduct the business of a Consumer Loan Company at:

Coral Springs, FL 33065

1.3 Records Location: Respondent J P Funding has received approval from the Department to maintain the records relating to its Consumer Loan license at the following location outside the State of Washington:

3300 University Dr. STE 311
Coral Springs, FL 33065

1 **1.4 Registered Agent:** The Registered Agent for Respondent J P Funding is listed in the application as:

5 **1.5 Annual Report:** An annual report is due to the Department on or before the first day of March of each
6 year, concerning the business and operations of each licensed place of business conducted during the preceding
7 calendar year. The annual report must be made under oath and must be in the form prescribed by the Director.

8 To date, Respondents have not provided the annual reports relating to the following calendar years: 1999, 2000,
9 2001, 2002, 2002, 2003 and 2004 due beginning March 1, 2000.

10 **1.6 Annual Assessment:** A calculation worksheet and an annual assessment fee are due to the Department
11 on or before the first day of March of each year, relating to the previous calendar year. To date, Respondents
12 have not provided the calculation worksheets or paid the annual assessment fees for the following calendar
13 years 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, and 2004 due beginning March 1, 2000.

14 **1.7 Surety Bond:** Insurance Company of North America cancelled Respondent J P Funding's surety bond
15 on January 2, 2001. To date, Respondents have not provided a reinstatement of the cancelled surety bond, or a
16 replacement surety bond or approved alternative.

17 **1.8 Issuance of Demand :** The Department sent a letter to the official company address dated December 8,
18 2000, notifying Respondents that the Department had received a notice of cancellation on their surety bond and
19 that the Respondents needed to replace the bond within 10 days. On September 26, 2001 the Department sent
20 another letter requiring a replacement of the bond and notifying Respondents that they had failed to file the
21 Annual Assessment Worksheet and the Consolidated Annual Report for the previous year. In October of 2003
22 the Department sent another notice of the failure to file the Annual Assessment Worksheet and the Consolidated
23 Annual report for years 1999, 2000, 2001, and 2002. Finally, on February 10, 2004 the Department sent
24 Respondent a directive by certified mail to bring the company into compliance with the Consumer Loan Act by
25 filing the Consolidated Annual Report and Annual Assessments Worksheet and to replace their cancelled surety

1 bond. The certified mailing was successfully sent to Respondent Parker's home address. Respondents have
2 failed to respond to any of the demands made by the Department.

3 **II. GROUNDS FOR ENTRY OF ORDER**

4 **2.1 Requirement to File Annual Report:** Based on the Factual Allegations set forth in Section I above,
5 Respondents are in apparent violation of RCW 31.04.155 and WAC 208-620-220(1) for failing to provide
6 annual reports to the Director, under oath and in the form prescribed by the Director, on or before the first day
7 of March, concerning the business and operations of each licensed place of business conducted during the
8 preceding calendar year.

9 **2.2 Requirement to Calculate and Pay Annual Assessment:** Based on the Factual Allegations set forth
10 in Section I above, Respondents are in apparent violation of RCW 31.04.085, WAC 208-620-190(3) and WAC
11 208-620-220(1) for failing to provide to the Director a completed annual assessment calculation worksheet and
12 failing to pay to the Director annual assessment fees on or before the first day of March, relating to the previous
13 calendar year.

14 **2.3 Requirement to Maintain Surety Bond:** Based on the Factual Allegations set forth in Section I
15 above, Respondents are in apparent violation of RCW 31.04.045(3), RCW 31.04.085, and WAC 208-620-
16 030(1) for failing to file and maintain a surety bond or approved alternative with the Director.

17 **2.4 Authority to Charge Examination and Investigation Fees:** Pursuant to RCW 31.04.145(3), WAC
18 208-620-180(1), WAC 208-620-190(2) and WAC 208-620-191, every licensee examined or investigated by the
19 Director or the Director's designee shall pay for the cost of the examination or investigation, calculated at the
20 rate of sixty-six dollars and eighty-one cents (\$66.81) per staff hour for time incurred from July 1, 2001 through
21 June 30, 2002, and sixty-nine dollars and one cent (\$69.01) per staff hour for time incurred after June 30, 2002..

22 **2.5 Authority to Revoke License:** Pursuant to RCW 31.04.093(3)(a) and (b), the Director may revoke a
23 license if a licensee fails to pay any fee due the state of Washington, fails to maintain in effect the required bond
24 or permitted substitute, fails to comply with any specific order or demand of the Director, or violates any
25 provision of the Act or any rule adopted under the Act.

1 **2.6 Authority to Issue Orders Directing Action:** Pursuant to RCW 31.04.093(5)(b), the Director may issue
2 an order directing a licensee to take such affirmative action as is necessary to comply with the Act.

3 **2.7 Accounting Requirements:** Based on the Factual Allegations set forth in Section I above,
4 Respondents are in apparent violation of RCW 31.04.155 for failing to make accurate and current books and
5 records readily available to the Department until at least twenty-five months have elapsed following the
6 effective period to which the books and records relate.

7 **III. NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ENTER ORDER**

8 Respondent's violations of the provisions of chapter 31.04 RCW and chapter 208-620 WAC, as set forth in
9 the above Factual Allegations and Grounds for Entry of Order, constitute a basis for the entry of an Order under
10 RCW 31.04.093, RCW 31.04.165 and RCW 31.04.205. Therefore, it is the Director's intention to ORDER that:

- 11 3.1 Respondent J P Funding Inc.'s license to conduct the business of a Consumer Loan Company be
12 revoked; and
- 13 3.2 Respondents maintain records in compliance with the Act and provide the Director with the location of
14 the books, records and other information relating to Respondent J P Funding Inc.'s consumer loan
15 business, and the name, address and telephone number of the individual responsible for maintenance of
16 such records in compliance with the Act.

17 **IV. AUTHORITY AND PROCEDURE**

18 This Statement of Charges and Notice of Intention to Enter an Order to Revoke Consumer Loan License is
19 entered pursuant to the provisions of RCW 31.04.093, RCW 31.04.165, RCW 31.04.202 and RCW 31.04.205,
20 and is subject to the provisions of chapter 34.05 RCW (The Administrative Procedure Act). Respondents may
21 make a written request for a hearing as set forth in the NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO DEFEND AND
22 OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING accompanying this Statement of Charges.

Appendix – Applicable Consumer Loan Statutes and Rules

RCW 31.04.045 License -- Application -- Fee -- Surety bond.

(1) Application for a license under this chapter must be in writing and in the form prescribed by the director. The application must contain at least the following information:

(a) The name and the business addresses of the applicant;

(b) If the applicant is a partnership or association, the name of every member;

(c) If the applicant is a corporation, the name, residence address, and telephone number of each officer and director;

(d) The street address, county, and municipality from which business is to be conducted; and

(e) Such other information as the director may require by rule.

(2) At the time of filing an application for a license under this chapter, each applicant shall pay to the director an investigation fee and the license fee in an amount determined by rule of the director to be sufficient to cover the director's costs in administering this chapter.

(3) Each applicant shall file and maintain a surety bond, approved by the director, executed by the applicant as obligor and by a surety company authorized to do a surety business in this state as surety, whose liability as such surety shall not exceed in the aggregate the penal sum of the bond. The penal sum of the bond shall be one hundred thousand dollars for each licensed location up to and including five licensed locations, and an additional ten thousand dollars for each licensed location in excess of five licensed locations, except that a licensee who makes a loan secured by real property shall maintain at a minimum a surety bond with a penal sum of not less than four hundred thousand dollars. The bond shall run to the state of Washington as obligee for the use and benefit of the state and of any person or persons who may have a cause of action against the obligor under this chapter. The bond shall be conditioned that the obligor as licensee will faithfully conform to and abide by this chapter and all the rules adopted under this chapter. The bond will pay to the state and any person or persons having a cause of action against the obligor all moneys that may become due and owing to the state and those persons under and by virtue of this chapter. In lieu of a surety bond, if the applicant is a Washington business corporation, the applicant may maintain unimpaired capital, surplus, and long-term subordinated debt in an amount that at any time its outstanding promissory notes or other evidences of debt (other than long-term subordinated debt) in an aggregate sum do not exceed three times the aggregate amount of its unimpaired capital, surplus, and long-term subordinated debt. The director may define qualifying "long-term subordinated debt" for purposes of this section.

RCW 31.04.075 Licensee -- Place of business.

The licensee may not maintain more than one place of business under the same license, but the director may issue more than one license to the same licensee upon application by the licensee in a form and manner established by the director.

Whenever a licensee wishes to change the place of business to a street address other than that designated in the license, the licensee shall give written notice to the director as required by rule, pay the license fee, and obtain the director's approval.

Appendix – Applicable Consumer Loan Statutes and Rules

1 **RCW 31.04.085 Licensee -- Assessment -- Bond -- Time of payment.**

2 A licensee shall, for each license held by any person, on or before the first day of each March, pay to the
3 director an annual assessment as determined by rule by the director. The licensee shall be responsible for
4 payment of the annual assessment for the previous calendar year if the licensee had a license for any time
5 during the preceding calendar year, regardless of whether they surrendered their license during the calendar
6 year or whether their license was suspended or revoked. At the same time the licensee shall file with the
7 director the required bond or otherwise demonstrate compliance with RCW [31.04.045](#).

9 **RCW 31.04.093 Licensing -- Applications -- Regulation of licensees--Director's duties -- Fines -- 10 Orders.**

11 (1) The director shall enforce all laws and rules relating to the licensing and regulation of licensees and
12 persons subject to this chapter.

13 (2) The director may deny applications for licenses for:

14 (a) Failure of the applicant to demonstrate within its application for a license that it meets the
15 requirements for licensing in RCW [31.04.045](#) and [31.04.055](#);

16 (b) Violation of an order issued by the director under this chapter or another chapter administered by the
17 director, including but not limited to cease and desist orders and temporary cease and desist orders;

18 (c) Revocation or suspension of a license to conduct lending, or to provide settlement services
19 associated with lending, by this state, another state, or by the federal government within five years of the
20 date of submittal of a complete application for a license; or

21 (d) Filing an incomplete application when that incomplete application has been filed with the
22 department for sixty or more days, provided that the director has given notice to the licensee that the
23 application is incomplete, informed the applicant why the application is incomplete, and allowed at least
24 twenty days for the applicant to complete the application.

25 (3) The director may suspend or revoke a license issued under this chapter if the director finds that:

(a) The licensee has failed to pay any fee due the state of Washington, has failed to maintain in effect
the bond or permitted substitute required under this chapter, or has failed to comply with any specific order
or demand of the director lawfully made and directed to the licensee in accordance with this chapter;

(b) The licensee, either knowingly or without the exercise of due care, has violated any provision of this
chapter or any rule adopted under this chapter; or

(c) A fact or condition exists that, if it had existed at the time of the original application for the license,
clearly would have allowed the director to deny the application for the original license. The director may
revoke or suspend only the particular license with respect to which grounds for revocation or suspension
may occur or exist unless the director finds that the grounds for revocation or suspension are of general
application to all offices or to more than one office operated by the licensee, in which case, the director
may revoke or suspend all of the licenses issued to the licensee.

(4) The director may impose fines of up to one hundred dollars per day upon the licensee, its employee or
loan originator, or other person subject to this chapter for:

- 1 (a) Any violation of this chapter; or
- 2 (b) Failure to comply with any order or subpoena issued by the director under this chapter.
- 3 (5) The director may issue an order directing the licensee, its employee or loan originator, or other person
subject to this chapter to:
- 4 (a) Cease and desist from conducting business in a manner that is injurious to the public or violates any
provision of this chapter;
- 5 (b) Take such affirmative action as is necessary to comply with this chapter; or
- 6 (c) Make restitution to a borrower or other person who is damaged as a result of a violation of this
chapter.
- 7
- 8 (6) The director may issue an order removing from office or prohibiting from participation in the affairs of
any licensee, or both, any officer, principal, employee or loan originator, or any person subject to this
chapter for:
- 9 (a) False statements or omission of material information from an application for a license that, if known,
would have allowed the director to deny the original application for a license;
- 10 (b) Conviction of a gross misdemeanor involving dishonesty or financial misconduct or a felony;
- 11 (c) Suspension or revocation of a license to engage in lending, or perform a settlement service related to
lending, in this state or another state;
- 12 (d) Failure to comply with any order or subpoena issued under this chapter; or
- 13 (e) A violation of RCW [31.04.027](#).
- 14
- 15 (7) Whenever the director determines that the public is likely to be substantially injured by delay in issuing
a cease and desist order, the director may immediately issue a temporary cease and desist order. The order
may direct the licensee to discontinue any violation of this chapter, to take such affirmative action as is
16 necessary to comply with this chapter, and may include a summary suspension of the licensee's license and
may order the licensee to immediately cease the conduct of business under this chapter. The order shall
17 become effective at the time specified in the order. Every temporary cease and desist order shall include a
provision that a hearing will be held upon request to determine whether the order will become permanent.
18 Such hearing shall be held within fourteen days of receipt of a request for a hearing unless otherwise
specified in chapter 34.05 RCW.
- 19 (8) A licensee may surrender a license by delivering to the director written notice of surrender, but the
surrender does not affect the licensee's civil or criminal liability, if any, for acts committed before the
20 surrender, including any administrative action initiated by the director to suspend or revoke a license,
impose fines, compel the payment of restitution to borrowers or other persons, or exercise any other
21 authority under this chapter.
- 22 (9) The revocation, suspension, or surrender of a license does not impair or affect the obligation of a
preexisting lawful contract between the licensee and a borrower.

Appendix – Applicable Consumer Loan Statutes and Rules

1 (10) Every license issued under this chapter remains in force and effect until it has been surrendered,
2 revoked, or suspended in accordance with this chapter. However, the director may on his or her own
initiative reinstate suspended licenses or issue new licenses to a licensee whose license or licenses have
3 been revoked if the director finds that the licensee meets all the requirements of this chapter.

4 **RCW 31.04.145 Investigations and examinations -- Director's duties -- Production of information -- Costs.**

5 (1) For the purpose of discovering violations of this chapter or securing information lawfully required
6 under this chapter, the director may at any time, either personally or by designees, investigate or examine
7 the loans and business and, wherever located, the books, accounts, records, papers, documents, files, and
8 other information used in the business of every licensee and of every person who is engaged in the business
9 making or assisting in the making of loans at interest rates authorized by this chapter, whether the person
10 acts or claims to act as principal or agent, or under or without the authority of this chapter. For these
11 purposes, the director or designated representatives shall have free access to the offices and places of
12 business, books, accounts, papers, documents, other information, records, files, safes, and vaults of all such
persons. The director or persons designated by the director may require the attendance of and examine
under oath all persons whose testimony may be required about the loans or the business or the subject
matter of any investigation, examination, or hearing and may require such person to produce books,
accounts, papers, records, files, and any other information the director or designated persons deem relevant
to the inquiry. The director may require the production of original books, accounts, papers, records, files,
and other information; may require that such original books, accounts, papers, records, files, and other
information be copied; or may make copies himself or herself or by designee of such original books,
accounts, papers, records, files, or other information. If a licensee or person does not attend and testify, or
does not produce the requested books, accounts, papers, records, files, or other information, then the
director or designated persons may issue a subpoena or subpoena duces tecum requiring attendance or
compelling production of the books, accounts, papers, records, files, or other information.

13 (2) The director shall make such periodic examinations of the affairs, business, office, and records of each
14 licensee as determined by rule.

15 (3) Every licensee examined or investigated by the director or the director's designee shall pay to the
16 director the cost of the examination or investigation of each licensed place of business as determined by
rule by the director.

18 **RCW 31.04.155 Licensee -- Recordkeeping -- Director's access -- Report requirement -- Failure to report.**

19 The licensee shall keep and use in the business such books, accounts, records, papers, documents, files, and
20 other information as will enable the director to determine whether the licensee is complying with this
chapter and with the rules adopted by the director under this chapter. The director shall have free access to
21 such books, accounts, records, papers, documents, files, and other information wherever located. Every
licensee shall preserve the books, accounts, records, papers, documents, files, and other information
22 relevant to a loan for at least twenty-five months after making the final entry on any loan. No licensee or
person subject to examination or investigation under this chapter shall withhold, abstract, remove, mutilate,
destroy, or secrete any books, accounts, records, papers, documents, files, or other information.

Appendix – Applicable Consumer Loan Statutes and Rules

1 Each licensee shall, on or before the first day of March of each year, file a report with the director giving
2 such relevant information as the director may reasonably require concerning the business and operations of
3 each licensed place of business conducted during the preceding calendar year. The report must be made
4 under oath and must be in the form prescribed by the director, who shall make and publish annually an
analysis and recapitulation of the reports. Every licensee that fails to file a report that is required to be filed
by this chapter within the time required under this chapter is subject to a penalty of fifty dollars per day for
each day's delay. The attorney general may bring a civil action in the name of the state for recovery of any
such penalty.

6 **RCW 31.04.165 Director -- Broad administrative discretion -- Rule making--Actions in superior court.**

7 (1) The director has the power, and broad administrative discretion, to administer and interpret this chapter
8 to facilitate the delivery of financial services to the citizens of this state by loan companies subject to this
chapter. The director shall adopt all rules necessary to administer this chapter and to ensure complete and
full disclosure by licensees of lending transactions governed by this chapter.

9 (2) If it appears to the director that a licensee is conducting business in an injurious manner or is violating
10 any provision of this chapter, the director may order or direct the discontinuance of any such injurious or
illegal practice.

11 (3) For purposes of this section, "conducting business in an injurious manner" means conducting business
12 in a manner that violates any provision of this chapter, or that creates the reasonable likelihood of a
violation of any provision of this chapter.

13 (4) The director or designated persons, with or without prior administrative action, may bring an action in
14 superior court to enjoin the acts or practices that constitute violations of this chapter and to enforce
compliance with this chapter or any rule or order made under this chapter. Upon proper showing, injunctive
relief or a temporary restraining order shall be granted. The director shall not be required to post a bond in
any court proceedings.

17 The proceedings for denying license applications, issuing cease and desist orders, suspending or revoking

19 **RCW 31.04.205 Enforcement of chapter -- Director's discretion -- Hearing -- Sanctions.**

20 The director or designated persons may, at his or her discretion, take such action as provided for in this
chapter to enforce this chapter. If the person subject to such action does not appear in person or by counsel
21 at the time and place designated for any administrative hearing that may be held on the action, then the
person shall be deemed to consent to the action. If the person subject to the action consents, or if after
hearing the director finds by a preponderance of the evidence that any grounds for sanctions under this
chapter exist, then the director may impose any sanction authorized by this chapter.

Appendix – Applicable Consumer Loan Statutes and Rules

WAC 208-620-030 Surety bond.

(1) **Bond required.** Each licensee shall file and maintain a surety bond, approved by the director, and executed by the applicant as obligor and by a surety company authorized to do a surety business in this state as surety. The surety company may not be a wholly owned subsidiary or an affiliate of the licensee.

(2) **Amount of bond.** The penal sum of the bond is one hundred thousand dollars for each branch office up to five branch offices. The amount of the bond is increased by ten thousand dollars for each additional branch office. For example:

Number of Branch Offices	Penal Sum of the Bond
1	\$100,000
2	\$200,000
3	\$300,000
4	\$400,000
5	\$500,000
6	\$510,000

(3) **Conditions on bond.** The bond shall run to the state as obligee for the use and benefit of the state and of any person or persons who may have a cause of action against the obligor under the act. The bond shall be conditioned that the obligor as licensee will faithfully conform to and abide by the act and all the rules adopted under the act. The bond will pay to the state and any person or persons having a cause of action against the obligor all moneys that may become due and owing to the state and those persons under and by virtue of the act.

WAC 208-620-180 Examinations.

(1) For the purpose of discovering violations of the act or this chapter or securing information lawfully required, the director or designee may investigate the loans and business of every licensee and of every person engaged in the business described in RCW 31.04.035. The director or designee may examine, wherever located, the records used in the business of every licensee and of every person who is engaged in the business described in RCW 31.04.035, whether the person acts or claims to act as principal or agent, or under or without the authority of this chapter. For that purpose the director or designee shall have access, at reasonable times during business hours, to the offices and places of business, records, safes, and vaults of all such persons. A licensee so examined shall pay to the director the cost of examining and supervising each licensed place of business at the rate specified in WAC [208-620-190](#)(2).

(2) The director or designee shall examine the affairs, business, office, and records of each licensee at least once each twenty-four months.

Appendix – Applicable Consumer Loan Statutes and Rules

WAC 208-620-190 Schedule of fees.

The director shall collect fees for services as specified below:

(1) Applications and certificates.

(a) A charge of \$92.51 per hour for services plus actual expenses for review of application and attendant investigation for:

- (i) New consumer loan company certificate of authority or licensed location certificate;
- (ii) Branch licensed locations certificate;
- (iii) Relocation of main office or branch;
- (iv) Notice of change of control;
- (v) Opinions rendered regarding interpretations of statutes and rules.

(b) A fee of \$102.79 for issuing the following certificates:

- (i) Certificate of authority;
- (ii) Licensed location certificate;
- (iii) Certificate of good standing.

(2) Examinations. A charge of \$66.81 per hour for regular and special examinations of the licensee's records. The director will submit a statement for the charges following the completion of any applicable examination. The charges must be paid within thirty days after the statement is submitted to the licensee.

(3) Annual assessment fee.

(a) An annual assessment fee based on adjusted total loan value as defined in (b) of this subsection. The amount of the annual assessment fee is 0.000174529 multiplied by the adjusted total loan value as calculated from the consolidated annual report for the previous calendar year.

(b) The "adjusted total loan value" is the sum of:

- (i) The total unpaid balance of loans originated subject to the act that were retained or purchased by the licensee; and
- (ii) The total unpaid balance of loans originated subject to the act that were sold by the licensee with servicing retained (if any); and
- (iii) The total amount of loans originated subject to the act that were sold by the licensee during the previous calendar year with servicing released (if any).

Appendix – Applicable Consumer Loan Statutes and Rules

1 **WAC 208-620-191 Fee increase.**

2 The division intends to increase its fee and assessment rates each year for several bienniums. The division
3 intends to initiate a rule making for this purpose each biennium. This rule provides for an automatic annual
4 increase in the rate of fees and assessments each fiscal year during the 2001-03 biennium.

5 (1) On July 1, 2002, the fee and assessment rates under WAC [208-620-190](#), as increased in the prior
6 fiscal year, will increase by a percentage rate equal to the fiscal growth factor for the then current fiscal
7 year. As used in this section, "fiscal growth factor" has the same meaning as the term is defined in RCW
8 43.135.025.

9 (2) The director may round off a rate increase under subsection (1) of this section. However, no rate
10 increase may exceed the applicable fiscal growth factor.

11 (3) By June 1 of each year, the director will make available a chart of the new rates that will take effect
12 on the immediately following July 1.

15 **WAC 208-620-200 Change of place of business.** A licensee may do business under the act only from
16 the location named on the license. This is not intended to prohibit loans by mail or the closing of real
17 estate-secured loans in an escrow company, a title insurance company or an attorney's office.

18 A licensee shall not change its place of business to another location until the director has approved the
19 change.

22 **WAC 208-620-220 Annual report and annual fee -- Due date -- Late penalties.**

23 (1) **Due date.** The director will mail a notice to each licensee showing the way to calculate the annual fee
24 due along with a worksheet for such purposes and the consolidated annual report form. The licensee will
25 calculate the annual fee on the worksheet. The licensee must submit its completed consolidated annual
report, worksheet and annual fee to the office of the director by March 1 of each year.

(2) **Late penalties.** A licensee that fails to submit the required annual report by the March 1 due date is
subject to a penalty of fifty dollars for each day of delay.
