Free Cybersecurity Hygiene Services & Resources Available from the Cybersecurity & Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), a Division of the US Department of Homeland Security Department

Introduction

The Division of Credit Unions' examination focus for 2020 highlighted cybersecurity risks as a continued area of concern. The National Association of State Credit Union Supervisors (NASCUS) held a webinar to share information about several **no cost** resources available from the Cybersecurity & Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA). These resources are available to credit unions of all sizes to assess and improve their cybersecurity posture and identify operational strengths and weaknesses.

The following is a list of free services that are currently available:

Vulnerability Scanning (Cyber Hygiene)

- Scanning of Internet accessible systems for vulnerabilities on a near continuous basis.
- Customers receive weekly reports that include current scan results, historic trends, and result comparisons to the national average.

Web Application Scanning

- Evaluates a publicly accessible website for potential bugs and weak configurations to provide recommendations for mitigating web application security risks.

Phishing Campaign Assessments

- Measures an organization's propensity to click on email phishing lures.
- Assessment results can be used to provide guidance and justify resources to defend against spear-phishing and increase user training and awareness.

Remote Penetration Testing

- Simulates tactics and techniques of real-world adversaries to identify and validate exploitable pathways.
- This service is ideal for testing perimeter defenses, the security of externally available applications, and the potential for exploitation of open source information.
